The meeting of the Vice-Chancellors' Committee comprising the Heads of all Public Sector Universities and higher education institutes (HEIs) was held on 2 February 2023 via Zoom. Vice-Chancellor Prof. Dr. Muhammad Kaleem Abbasi participated in the meeting, in which several agenda items included the revival of the HEC ordinance in its original form, the current financial crisis in the universities, issues related to search committees, TTS and BPS Faculty related matters, University Act, private affiliations, professional councils, students' unions/societies, and several others were discussed. Registrar UAJK Prof. Dr. Ayesha Sohail, Director Finance Prof. Dr. Muhammad Qayyum Khan, Director Planning & Development Prof. Dr. Ansar Yaseen, Director QEC Prof. Dr. Ayaz Arif, and Director ORIC, Prof. Dr. Muhammad Naeem Ahmed were also present on the occasion.

Kashmir in Contemporary Multipolar World

& Indian Occupation

The Department of International Relations, University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (UAJK) in collaboration with the Kashmir Institute of International Relations (KIIR) organized a day-long seminar titled "Kashmir in a Contemporary Multipolar World and Indian Illegal Occupation: Role of High Politics in Illegal Occupation and Human Rights Crimes" at the Auditorium Kashmir Studies, Chella Campus, UAJK, on February 2, 2023. Altaf Hussain Wani, a prominent Kashmiri leader, renowned human rights activist, and chairman KIIR, addressed the seminar and discussed the latest human rights situation in Indian-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IOJ&K), focusing on the post-August 5, 2019 scenario. He informed the audience that gross human rights violations being committed by the Indian military and paramilitary forces in the occupied valley have increased manifold since August 2019. Chairman KIIR talked about the level of oppression and repression that Kashmiris are facing and how AJK can play its role in the Kashmir cause. Assistant Professor and Head of the Department of International Relations at Riphah University Islamabad, Dr. Awais Bin Wasi, delivered a detailed lecture on the Multipolar World Order and the Kashmir conflict. He argued that the US has fixed its eyes on the Chinese rise and is militarizing the Indo-Pacific region through quadrilateral and integrated deterrence. He also talked about the Indian economic



and military role in the global community and urged Pakistan to set its house in order to effectively plead the Kashmir issue at the international level. In his closing remarks, Dr. Mehmood Hussain, HoD of the IR Department at UAJK, argued that the multipolarity has brought both opportunities and challenges to Pakistan. He stated that China's official approach towards Kashmir has changed since the announcement of the BRI. Similarly, he illuminated the rise of Russian interest after India entered the American block. He said it is high time for Pakistan to tap the opportunities and bring forward the cause of Kashmir, settling its economic and political chaos first. During the seminar, students of the IR Department presented their papers and paid rich tributes to their brothers and sisters in Occupied Kashmir for their matchless struggle and sacrifices. In the end, the question-and-answer session was held and concluded with the distribution of certificates among the participating students.

UAJK observed Kashmir Solidarity Day



The University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir organized a series of programs on the occasion of Kashmir Solidarity Day to pay tribute to the people of illegally Indian-occupied Jammu and Kashmir for their valiant struggle for freedom and the right to self-determination. The events including the solidarity march, posters and pictures exhibition, and Kashmir cultural show were organized to highlight the different aspects of the Kashmir freedom movement, Indian atrocities, and gross violation of human rights by Indian forces and other state apparatus. A conference was also held which was addressed by different speakers.

Addressing the conference, Registrar Professor Dr. Ayesha Sohail termed the Kashmir issue as an unfinished agenda of the partition of the subcontinent and said that peace and security in South Asia could not be secured without resolving the Kashmir conflict in accordance with the aspirations of the Kashmiris and the resolutions of the United Nations Security Council. She said that three generations of Kashmiris have made immense sacrifices to materialize the dream of freedom.

"Their supreme sacrifices unparalleled in human history will never go to waste and the day is not far when the dawn of freedom will dawn in Occupied Jammu and Kashmir", she said.

Dr. Ayesha Sohail urged the students and teachers of the departments of Kashmir Studies, International Relations, and Law of the University to carry out research work to find a viable and legal solution for the Kashmir conflict in the changed global scenario. The Chairperson Institute of Kashmir Studies Dr. Sumaira, Director of Student Affairs Dr. Imtiaz Awan, Professor Dr. Wajid Aziz Lone, and other speakers emphasized that Kashmiris have been offering sacrifices for the last two centuries in general and the last 75 years in particular. The freedom-loving Kashmiris not only laid down their lives, and sacrificed their honor and dignity but have never abandoned their struggle for freedom and demand for their right to self-determination. They said that the freedom struggle of Kashmir will continue relentlessly until Kashmiris get their democratic right, the right to self-determination.

Students of the Arts and Design Department of the University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir

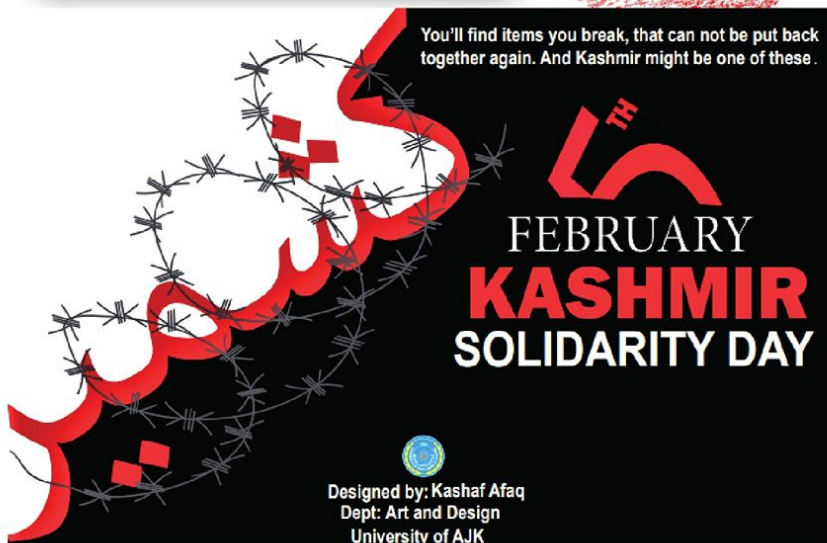

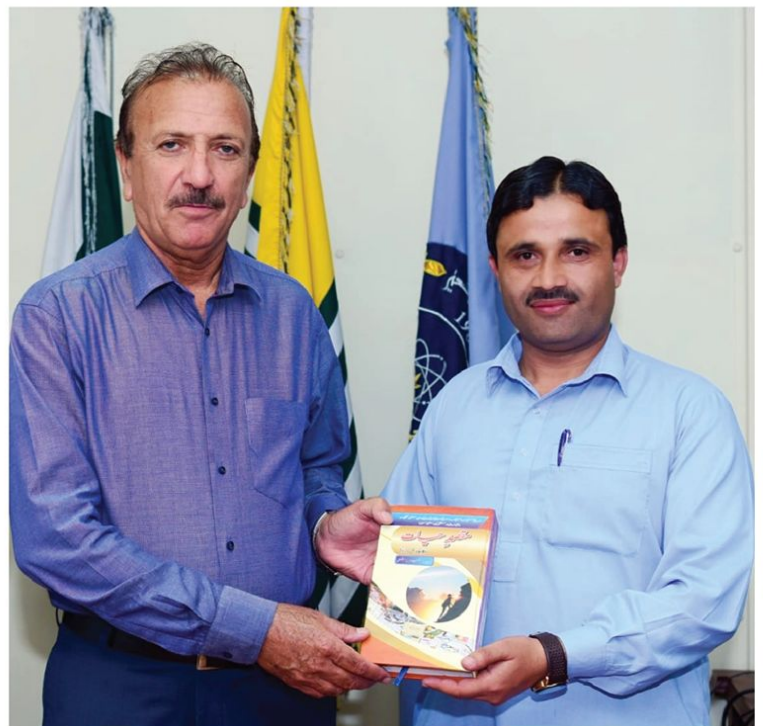

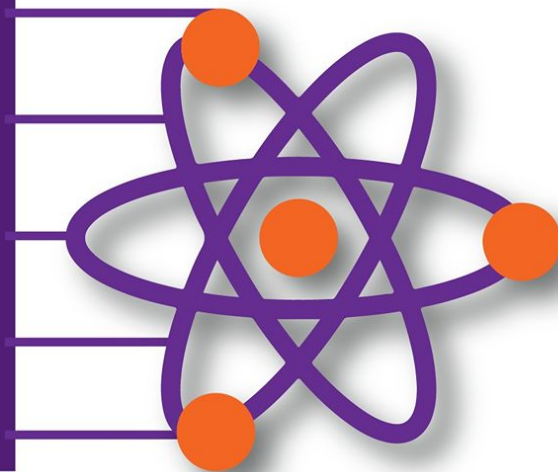

DMS launches to streamline research work tracking

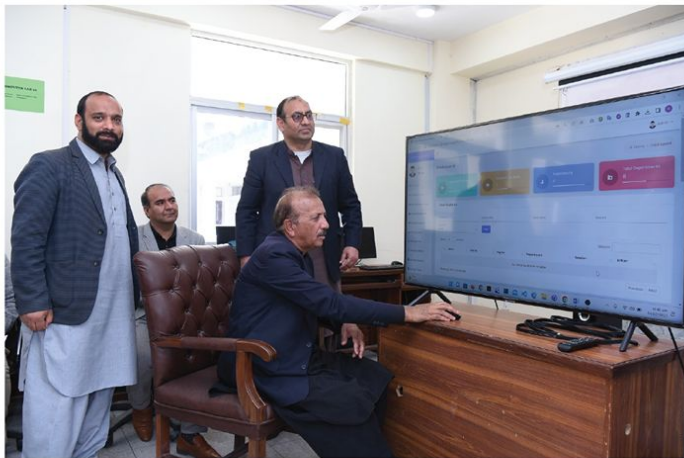

a feather in cap of UAJK



Named after the eminent Islamic philosopher Ibn Khaldun, the library and the information resource center is located at King Abdullah Campus (KAC), Chatter Kallas on the outskirts of Muzaffarabad City. The five-story building of the library in the heart of the newly built campus of the university offers a vast collection of general and specialized books, including a significant collection of rare books and reading material for master and doctoral studies.

Established under the special directives of Vice-Chancellor Prof. Dr. Muhammad Kaleem Abbasi in December 2021, a state-of-the-art library and information resource Centre is now fully functional to serve the students, faculty, researchers, and staff of the university of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (UAJK).



With a seating capacity of 600 students at a time and a separate space for the faculty to provide them with all necessary resources related to their academic assignments, the library building houses 18 large rooms, separate rooms for administrative offices, and 10 spacious halls where study materials are displayed.

Additionally, five sizable halls are set aside for group research work. Ibn Khaldun Library and Information Resource Center (IKLIRC), according to Deputy Chief Librarian Farhat Hussain Kazmi, currently houses over 98,600 printed, and 60,000 electronic books, allows access to 25 leading research journals and a special area for university publications. Other educational resources, such as the HEL Digital Library and the PASTIC Lincoln Corner Database, which is growing swiftly, are also available in the library.

The IKLIRC not only plays a significant role in enhancing the learning experience of the students, providing them with all the materials and services they need to improve their knowledge but will also attract the attention of the academic and literary circles of the state in the future. A few images of the library's stock area and study spaces are shown as an introduction to this great information resource center.

A 29-member delegation, led by Chairman Higher Education Commission (HEC) Dr. Mukhtar Ahmed, recently visited the United Kingdom (UK) to attend a leadership development study program organized by the Pak-UK Education Gateway. The program, which was organized by the British Council Pakistan in collaboration with the HEC, aimed to prepare academics and administrators for the future by building their capacity in governance, academics, and research. The delegation, which included prominent academicians from Pakistani and AJK universities, also aimed to learn from the rich experiences of the British higher education system and the long history of the successes achieved by universities in the UK. The Vice-Chancellor of the University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (UAJK), Prof Dr. Muhammad Kaleem Abbasi, was also part of the delegation, which arrived in the UK from February 5 to 14, 2023. During their visit, the delegation interacted with education leaders, policy makers, and senior staff of apex bodies overseeing and regulating institutions of higher education. The program is designed to enable participants to learn from successful universities, both nationally and internationally, and to reflect on their leadership styles and practices with a view to leading more effectively.

The group examined the role of governance, financial strategies, enhancing the student experience, and developing research to assess their impact. All of this was done in the context of the policy framework for TNE in Pakistan, seeking advice and feedback from the UK sector. The Pak-UK EG Program aims to provide leadership development for governance, academics, and research to prepare academics for the future. The first cohort of the program will help the HEC to develop core guidelines for a University Leadership program. The program objectives are set to provide benefits at the international, national, institutional, and individual levels. It is worth mentioning that the Pak-UK Education Gateway Program was launched three years ago as an important step towards the development of the higher education sector in Pakistan. Due to the coronavirus pandemic and travel restrictions, no face-to-face meeting could be held. However, the program continued virtually during the pandemic, and the close interaction of all partners in Pakistan and the UK resulted in achieving several milestones and key objectives even during the times of lock down.
