The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) or Global Goals are a collection of 17 interlinked global goals designed to be a "blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all". The SDGs were set up in 2015 by the United Nations General Assembly (UN-GA) and are intended to be achieved by 2030. The seventeen SDGs have been listed in the Table-1.

For better and more sustainable future for all, the Faculty of Engineering has also made the compliance of SDGs compulsory for all students. the thesis of the students contains one chapter on SDG compliance which explains the benefits of SDGs and how the project is meeting SDGs.
